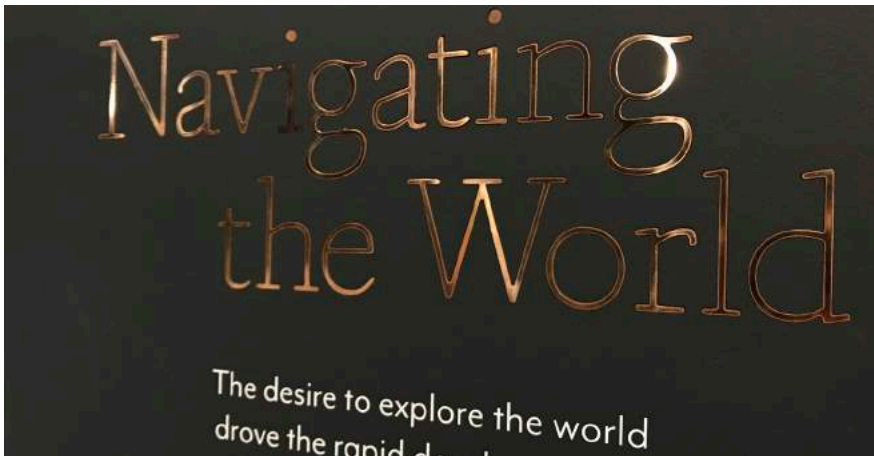

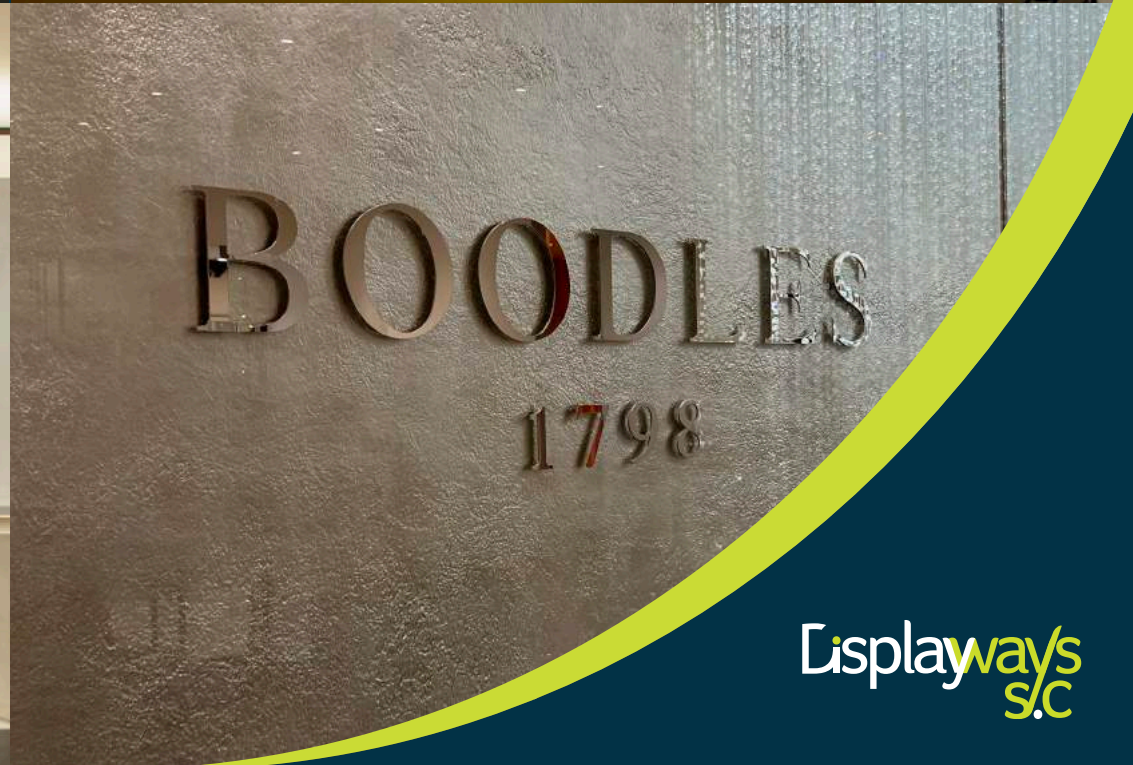

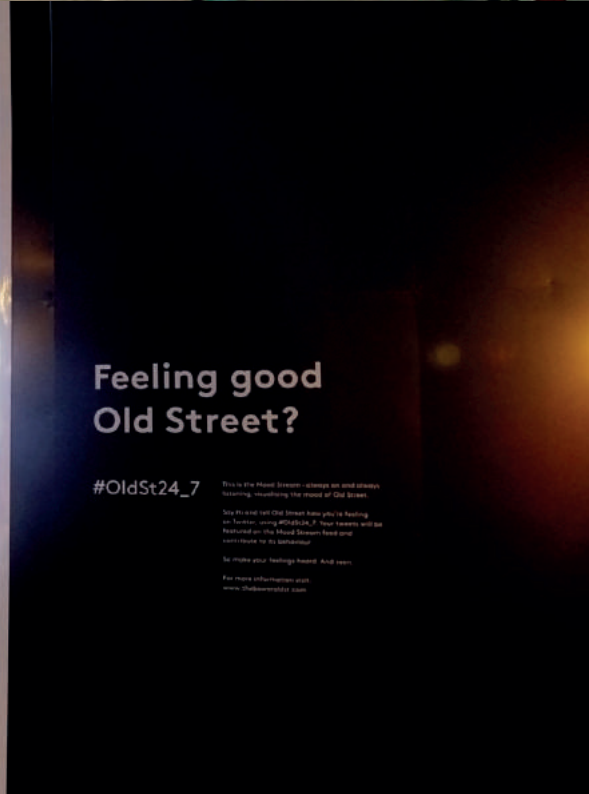

THE BIG APPLE
The Big Apple was first used as a nickname for New York City in the 1920s by 'Ragtime' Billy Taylor. The *Chicago Defender*, an African-American newspaper, was taken up by John Fitz Gerald, a racing writer, who wrote, 'There's only one Big Apple. The American jazz scene adopted the name. The Apple Night Club opened in Harlem in 1926. A craze of the same name swept America a few years later. After that, it fell out of fashion until New York's marketing and tourism organisation promoted it in the early 1970s, and then it stuck.

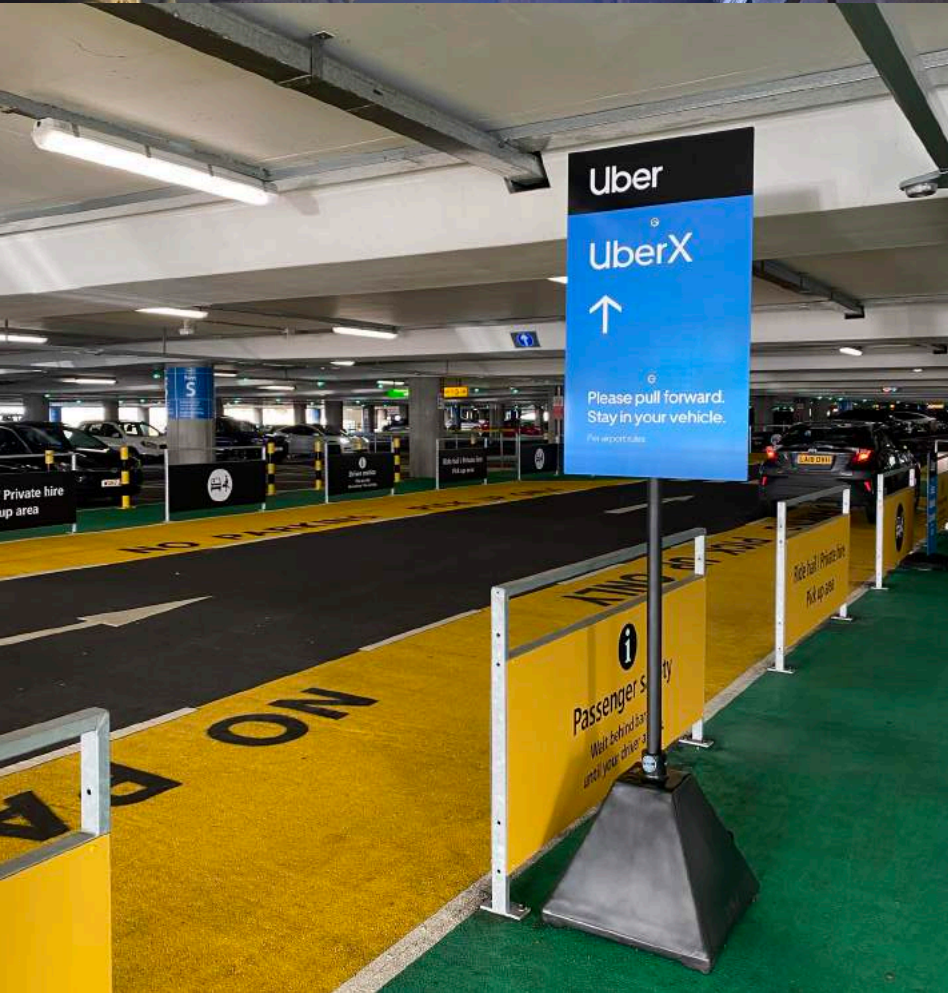
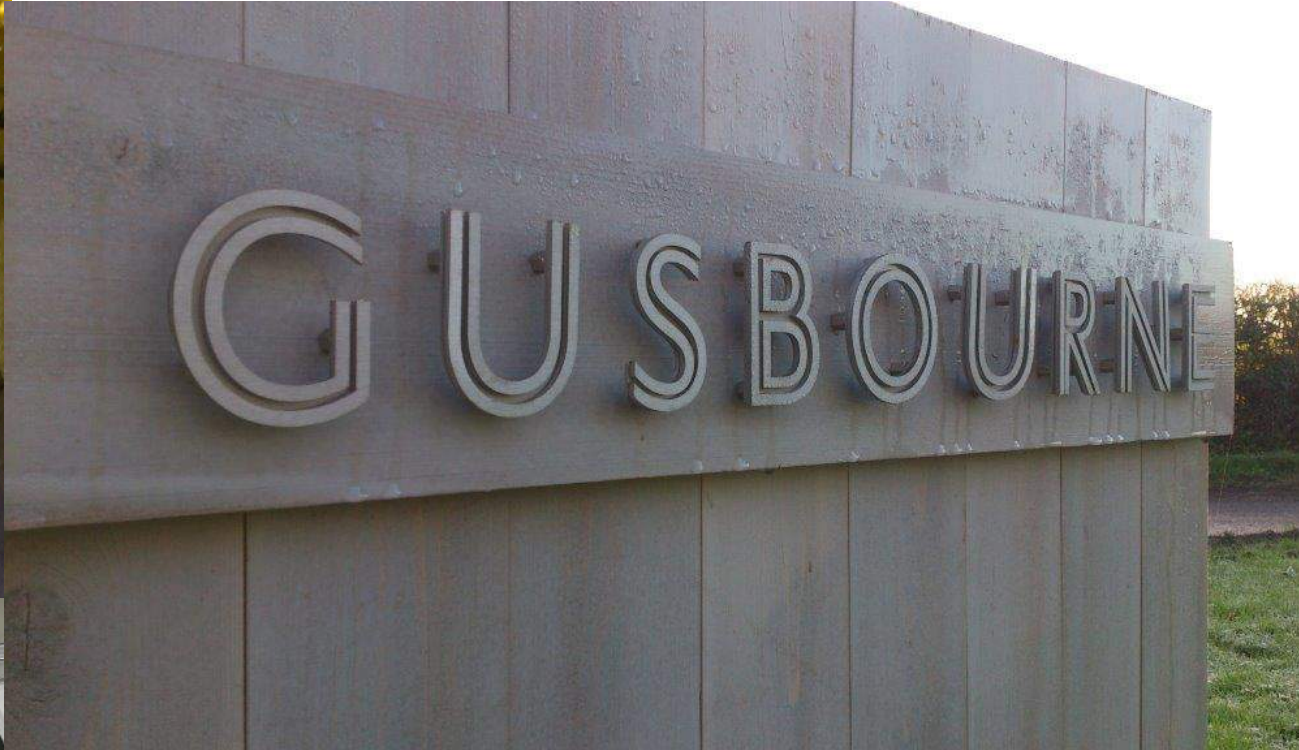


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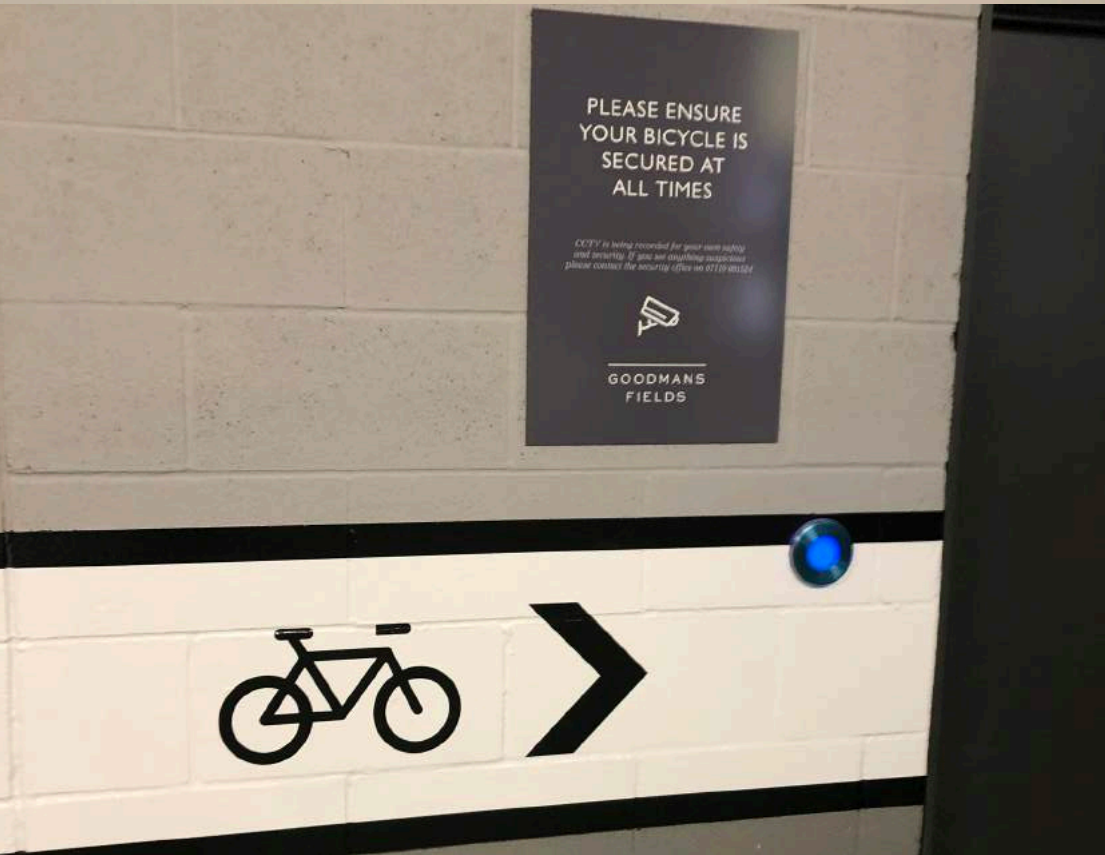
